

Study Abroad Scholarships and Fellowships

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship is a grant program that enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, thereby gaining skills critical to our national security and economic competitiveness.

The Gilman Scholarship Program is open to U.S. citizen undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding at a two-year or four-year college or university to participate in study and intern abroad programs worldwide.

Deadline: Early March for summer and fall; early October for spring

Award Amount: Range from \$100 to \$5,000; up to \$8,000 (for critical language studies)

The Boren Awards

Boren Scholarships, an initiative of the National Security Education Program, provide unique funding opportunities for U.S. undergraduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests, and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East.

Deadline: Early February

Award Amount: \$8,000 (8-week summer); \$10,000 (semester); \$20,000 (6-12 months)

Critical Language Scholarship Program

The Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) Program is a fully funded language and cultural enrichment program of the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. It is an intensive overseas language and cultural immersion program for American students enrolled at U.S. colleges and universities. The program includes intensive language instruction and structured cultural enrichment experiences designed to promote rapid language gains.

Deadline: Late November

Award Amount: Fully funded

Freeman-ASIA

Freeman Awards for Study in Asia (Freeman-ASIA) provides scholarships for U.S. undergraduate students with demonstrated financial need to study abroad in East or Southeast Asia. The funding assists with the cost of the study abroad program and related expenses.

Deadline: Summer Deadline - March; Fall/Academic Year - April

Award Amount: \$3,000 (summer); \$5,000 (semester); up to \$7,000 (academic year)

Fund for Education Abroad

The Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) invests in promising students with financial need who wish to study abroad. Potential applicants who meet our eligibility requirements may participate on any international education program that meets their academic objectives.

Deadline: Early January

Award Amount: Up to \$10,000 for full academic year; \$5,000 for fall or spring

Rainbow Scholarship

The Rainbow Scholarship awards deserving lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) students who aim to participate in high-quality, rigorous education abroad programs. To be considered for the Rainbow Scholarship, applicants must self-identify on the Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) scholarship application.

Deadline: Early January

Award Amount: Up to \$10,000

Bridging Scholarships for Study in Japan

The Bridging Project offers scholarships to American undergraduate students participating in study-abroad programs in Japan. Funding from private foundations and major U.S. corporations, through donations to the nonprofit US-Japan Bridging Foundation, makes it possible to award about 100 scholarships each year to assist students with the travel and living expenses they will incur while studying abroad in Japan for a semester or an academic year.

Deadline: Fall and Academic Year applications - early April; Spring applications - early October

Award Amount: \$2,500-\$4,000

Morgan Stanley Scholarships for Study in Japan

Morgan Stanley offers scholarships to US undergraduates. Eligible students include students at US universities who have an interest in economics and international finance and who have been accepted for study in Japan for the academic year.

Deadline: April

Award Amount: \$7,500

Ashley Soule Conroy Foundation Scholarship

Scholarship awards of \$4,000 for undergraduate degree seeking students on semester or year study abroad programs. Students must have demonstrated financial need as demonstrated by FAFSA.

Deadline: October 1 for spring; June 1 for fall

Award Amounts: \$4,000

CRCC Asia

CRCC Asia believes that all students should have access to world-class internship programs and travel experiences. With the launch of their 2019 Inclusion Initiative in November, they will be providing 5 fully funded scholarships to provide access to their programs – and the personal and professional development opportunities that follow – for students from underrepresented communities.

Deadline: Late November

Award Amount: 1 month internship with CRCC Asia + Round-trip Airfare

IAESTE United States

IAESTE is a global organization promoting intercultural exchange between students in STEM fields. IAESTE provides international professional opportunities for students in the technical fields (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Architecture). Participants complete internships at host institutions ranging from large multinational corporations to university research centers to startups.

Deadline: December 1

Award Amount: Stipend that covers at least the cost of living –housing, transportation and food – in their host city. Housing accommodations and other administrative services, such as assistance with the visa process, are provided by the local IAESTE organization in the respective host country.

Cultural Vistas Fellowship

Multinational professional development program that includes eight-week summer internships in Argentina, Germany, and Hong Kong.

Deadline: November 15

Award Amount: All program related travel expenses and accommodations.

Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals (CBYX)

The Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals (CBYX) is a fellowship funded by the German Bundestag and U.S. Department of State, that annually provides 75 American and 75 German young professionals, between the ages of 18-24, the opportunity to spend one year in each other's countries, studying, interning, and living with hosts on a cultural immersion program. The program consists of three phases: two months of intensive German language training, four months of classes in one's academic or career field at a university, technical or professional school and five-month internships in one's career field.

Deadline: December 1

Award Amount: Fully funded
