- To be eligible for a Major in Dietetics, a student must have a minimum cumulative "professional" grade point average of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale . This GPA must be maintained to remain in the didactic program in dietetics (DPD), graduate from Fontbonne University and receive a DPD Verification Statement. **Students must receive a grade of C- or better in all courses designated as professional courses.**
- All courses except those in English (ENG), Fine Arts (FNAR), Government (GOV), History (HST), Information Technology (INT), Philosophy (PHL), Literature (LIT), and Religion (REL), as well as HES291 and HES497 are designated as "professional courses" and are designed to meet the requirements for a DPD accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Dietetic Education (CADE) of the American Dietetic Association for entrance into an accredited supervised practice program following graduation.
- It is important to note that many supervised practice programs require, or have students currently enrolled with minimum grade point averages that exceed those required for graduation from Fontbonne (see the HES Student Handbook for details).
