

Students not meeting the minimum language requirement for academic programs may apply conditionally, available for:

- All bachelor's programs
- All graduate business programs

and computer science

INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

HOW TO APPLY | STEP 3 English Requirements

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate

Fontbonne University recognizes that language barriers should not keep academically qualified students from achieving their higher education goals. That's why we offer prospective undergraduate students two options for admissions (1) unconditional admission (2) conditional admission. See below details regarding requirements and important information for each option.

1 <u>unconditional admission</u>

Students that submit a test of English report with the below scores or higher will be granted unconditional admission to Fontbonne upon acceptance of their application. This status allows the student to enroll in a full course load of 12 academic credit hours or more. Tuition charges for a full time undergraduate student covers the student for 12-18 credit hours of study.

Minimum test score required TOEFL IELTS EIKEN

ADVISING NOTE: Undergraduate students below a TOEFL 65 or no equivalent English test will be required to take Fontbonne University's institutional English placement exam. This exam will determine the amount of ESL and/or academic in which the student may enroll.

2 CONDITIONAL ADMISSION (BRIDGE PROGRAM)


Prospective undergraduate students that do not meet the minimum English requirement for full-time academic study or do not have a TOEFL/IELTS score may still apply for conditional admission. Conditional admission blends together ESL (English as a Second Language) classes with academic courses until the student is prepared to enroll as a full-time undergraduate student. Students will take an institutional English placement exam during orientation week; test results will determine Bridge Program level, students may take the test at any time to advance levels.

- A department application may be required
- Theatre/Fine Arts applicants MUST submit a resume/portfolio of previous work
- GRE/GMAT not required (except MS in Accounting students GMAT 475 required AND MS Computer Science-GRE 290).

TRANSFER STUDENTS; OR, TRANSFERRING CREDIT

- ALL ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLUS Copy of 1-94, Visa, and previous 1-20s AND Transfer Form
- TRANSCRIPT(S) FROM ALL COLLEGE(S) ATTENDED, IF FOREIGN TRANSCRIPTS, THE TRANSCRIPT MUST BE EVALUATED BY WORLD EDUCATION SERVICES (WES) www.wes.org.

IMPORTANT:

- Applications should be completed and the application fee paid before any
 - documents are sent.
- Bank statements must be original and no older than 120 days
- If bank statement is not in the student's name, a sponsor letter must be filled submitted
- Transcripts should be original and translated into English

IMPORTANT: Students must show financial support for tuition and living expenses costs for one year of study (or length of program if shorter) in the form of an original bank statement or financial guarantee letter from a sponsoring organization, and corresponding letter of financial guarantee if the student is not the account holder or sponsor (English only). These documents must be original.

Students should begin the visa application once the I-20 is confirmed to be correct. Please visit http://www.unitedstatesvisas.gov for visa information by country. REQUIRED: Inform Fontbonne of visa status (accepted or denied). In the case of a visa denial, agents should provide Fontbonne with the denial justification. Inform Fontbonne if student selects another school. Inform Fontbonne if student defers attendance.	Check I-20 for accuracy. The I-20 document contains important information regarding the student's study in the United States. Students should carefully check the information in section 1 to ensure it is correct. Section 7 indicates the total amount of tuition money it will cost for the student's program as well as estimated living expenses. The U.S. government will require proof of financial support for the total amount in section 7. Check and review acceptance letter and materials for accuracy Inform Fontbonne of decision (confirm attendance) Student signs information release form (if they accept conditions)

HOUSING / RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Fontbonne offers international students a variety of different housing options to fit their individual needs.

NOTE: international students are not required to live in Fontbonne University housing; however, it is recommended that freshman and MBA students live on-campus unless they have arranged off-campus housing through family or friends. Students that choose to live in Fontbonne housing should plan to apply and pay the corresponding housing deposit immediately after their U.S. visa is approved as <u>rooms are subject to availability and will not be held until the deposit is paid.</u>

IMPORTANT: F-1 visa holders may only enter the United States 30 days prior to the start of the semester, as such housing arrangements should be made in accordance with this regulation.

ST. JOSEPH'S HALL

St. Joseph Hall houses approximately 124 students. It is home to a mix of undergraduate students. St Joseph Hall rooms are designed to house two students per room. The furnishings include room chairs, beds, vanities, and a large shared desk

SOUTHWEST APARTMENTS

Apartment-style suites house four residents and are designed with a kitchen, living room, four single bedrooms, a full bath and storage closet. Furnishings include window treatments, couch, chairs, lamps, end tables and bar stools.

MEDAILLE HALL

Medaille Hall is designed for single occupancy. Most rooms are suites, which consist of two single rooms sharing an adjoining bathroom (residents are the same gender). Bed, dresser, desk and chair are standard room fixtures. Heating/cooling units are controlled by occupants.

COTTA HALL

Cotta Hall is available to graduate students. A Cotta Hall apartment has two bedrooms with a shared living room, kitchenette and bathroom. Two people (same gender) are assigned to each apartment. The following items are Included in your monthly rent: furniture, wireless internet, cable TV, local phone service, utilities and your rent.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

It is suggested that students make travel arrangements to arrive no more than one or two days prior to the orientation date listed in the acceptance packet, unless other travel plans are arranged that do not require university assistance or housing before this time.

IMPORTANT: Students traveling directly to Fontbonne University should plan to arrive at St. Louis Lambert International Airport (STL)

ORIENTATION

International orientation is MANDATORY and includes informative sessions that will assist students with understanding visa regulations, university policies, course registration and other technical details of living and studying in the U.S.

Also, the orientation sessions are a great opportunity for new international students to connect with one another and current students from around the world, in addition to meeting the university staff and faculty.

AIRPORT PICKUP

If a student would like for Fontbonne University to organize airport pickup, they must complete and submit the Airport Shuttle Request Form (available on our website). Airport pickup is available only for students living in Fontbonne University housing arrangements. Airport pickup is offered one day only in August (date varies).

If a student arrives in St. Louis before the scheduled airport pick up date, students are responsible for arranging their own transportation from the airport to a local hotel for a room. An airport taxi to Fontbonne University may cost between \$35-50 USD.
