

Financial Aid



FOLLOW THIS CHECKLIST TO MAKE COLLEGE AS AFFORDABLE AS POSSIBLE.

File the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov. Make sure you are using the correct FAFSA form for the year in which you will be enrolling. Add Fontbonne's school code (002464) to get a complete financial aid estimate.

ATTN: Remember to file the FAFSA (FAFSA.gov) each year before February 1st to meet Fontbonne University priority deadline.

- Contact your admission counselor to find out if you might be eligible for Fontbonne talent or recognition scholarships.
- Search for outside scholarships. There are many scholarships available that go unawarded because students don't apply for them.
- Attend any financial aid planning nights that are available through your high school or community organizations.





THE CHECKLIST

- 3. Receive a priority room assignment if your deposit and application are turned in before the deadline.
- 4. Receive all required immunizations, fill out a medical form, and turn it into the office of residential life before the deadline.
