

Latin Honors

Latin honors reflect the academic excellence of all of the undergraduate coursework taken in preparation for the undergraduate degree. Students must earn a combined grade point average of 3.7. Cum laude is awarded for combined cumulative grade point averages of 3.7 to 3.79 cumulative grade point average. Magna cum laude is awarded for combined cumulative grade point averages of 3.8 to 3.89. Summa cum laude is awarded for combined cumulative grade point averages of 3.9 or above.

Dean's Award

The Dean's Award is presented to graduating seniors who transferred to Fontbonne and achieved a cumulative grade point average of 3.7 or above on a minimum of 60 credit hours taken at Fontbonne.

TELOS Scholars

The TELOS program is a holistic honors program. TELOS scholars have completed a portfolio of academic and co-curricular projects that emphasize personal transformation, exploration outside their majors, leadership, deepened experiences within their majors, and service and social justice

The Significance of the Chain Ceremony

In 1927, the first class of Fontbonne began a tradition that continues today. Originally connected to the shovel used for Fontbonne's ground-breaking in 1924, a bronze chain bears the year of the first graduating class at its head, and each subsequent graduating class is connected by square links inscribed with each graduation year. A new link is added each year at commencement ceremonies to continue this unique part of the university's history.

Academic Dress

The gold cord worn by undergraduates represents graduation honors. Other cords and medallions represent honor societies in which graduates are members. The wearing of white stoles signifies participation in academic convocation. International students may be wearing stoles representative of their home countries.

Bell Ringing Tradition

Seventy-three years ago, the women in the graduating class of 1949, donated the chapel bell. It was then rung at each Commencement, with the number of rings coinciding with the year of the graduating class (for instance, 60 rings in 1960, 88 rings in 1988, and so on.)

In 2000, a new tradition was started and the bell was rung one time for each graduating student as a way for Fontbonne to celebrate each individual student's effort and success. Several years later, each graduate was invited to actually ring the bell after the ceremony.

As you entered Fontbonne, you were asked to ring the chapel bell and now as you move beyond Fontbonne we invite you, members of the graduating class of 2022, to ring the bell as a way to celebrate your accomplishments. You'll find the chapel bell rope lowered at the back entrance to Ryan Hall and you may each take a turn to ring the bell as you are sent into the world. President Blattner will be present to congratulate you and share in a picture.
